



Development at Kwa Sani is multifaceted, it is not determined by a single factor, and it is how one perceives as development in the broader spectrum. At Kwa Sani we believe in investing in education at an early age, this part of the district is mostly dominated by farms and we have few schools, one can mention that in places such as Underberg and Himeville we do not have the public schools and children are travelling a distance to get to school. With these strides we are slowly beginning to change the whole scenario and as Kwa Sani we are on a mission to define change. Education is one of the 5 key priorities of the government and we are making our contribution in achieving one of these key priorities as Kwa Sani. A municipality that does not invest in its children does not have a future, hence the saying “education is the key to success” must be instilled from an early age.

The job is still far from complete, hence we plea to the department of education to prioritise Kwa Sani in their plans so that one day we will see more and more schools being built in this area. Most people are employed in farms and hotels around Kwa Sani and it is these sectors that have contributed to the economy of this municipality, however Tata Madiba once mentioned that “Education is the great engine of personal development. It is through education that the daughter of a peasant can become a doctor, that the son of a mine worker can become the head of the mine that a child of farmworkers can become the president of a great nation. The other good thing about these two projects is that they will bring about job opportunities to both skilled and unskilled people of Kwa Sani.
