The Municipality is aware of the poor drainage system of Underberg and the conditions of our roads; however the municipality is still waiting for the Department of Transport who have promised to sort those issues as they are currently waiting for their new financial year to commence soon. The project of

constructing a welcoming sign to Underberg has begun and will be finalised soon, this will allow people who are visiting or passing by the town to feel welcomed and at home. On Sunday the 16 of March 2014 Kwa Sani will be hosting a Mayoral cup, the venues will be Enhlanhleni sports field and Underberg, the prizes will be awarded to the victors on the day, and hence this tournament will be used as a build-up or selection for the upcoming provincial Salga Games 2014.
